

# ESSENTIAL INFORMATION GERMANY, SWITZERLAND AND ITALY

## PASSPORT AND VISA INFORMATION

Your passport needs to be valid for **at least six (6) months** after your journey ends, and should have a minimum of five (5) blank visa pages for entry and exit stamps.

Holders of U.S. and Canadian passports are not required to obtain a tourist visa for entry into Germany, Switzerland or Italy for stays of up to 90 days.

Citizens of other countries should contact the appropriate consular office for entry requirements pertaining to their journey.

## CASH & CREDIT CARDS

Major credit cards are widely accepted, and there is easy access to ATM outlets. In smaller cities, shops and cafes may prefer cash payment for goods and services. Unattended self-service payment kiosks such as those in parking garages, train stations or gas stations only accept a Chip and PIN card or cash. Carrying moderate amounts of euros is advisable as smaller establishments in Italy may only accept cash.

## PACKING LIST

Please use the provided A&K luggage tags, even if your bags already have ID tags. This makes it easier for A&K staff to find and manage your luggage for you.

### Clothing

Choose versatile, casual clothing that can be layered if the weather (or level of air-conditioning) requires. Cotton and other light fabrics are comfortable choices for summertime. Spring and autumn temperatures dictate medium-weight clothing selections. Pack a coat, hat, gloves, boots, warm socks and sleepwear, if you are visiting Germany, Switzerland or Northern Italy between late October and early April. Smart casual attire is appropriate for evenings. Formal clothing is not necessary.

Cathedrals, churches, destinations within Vatican City and other religious sites require conservative dress. Arms, legs and shoulders should be covered – no shorts. This applies to both men and women. For women, barebacked, low-necked dresses or tops or short skirts, are not considered appropriate attire.
